REGULATIONS

1. The Committee will take the greatest care of all exhibits, but it is a condition of entry that they are not held responsible for loss, damage or delay in return of the same.
2. All entries must be entirely hand-made by the exhibitor, except where otherwise stated. They must have been completed since 2018 and not exhibited at any previous Cartmel Show.
3. **ENTRY FEES** – 40p per entry. Cheques made payable to Cartmel Show (Village Industries Section). **Please send stamped addressed envelope for correspondence – see entry form.**
4. **Entries must be received by the Secretary on Official Entry Form by SATURDAY 18th JULY, 2020 and must be accompanied by the Entry Fee and SAE for the return of labels. No late entries accepted.**
5. EXHIBITS with labels securely attached (NO PINS) to be delivered to the Village Hall, Cartmel on **THURSDAY 30th JULY** between **9am** and **12.30pm**. Post parcels to be sent to the ASSISTANT SECRETARY before that date. After **30th July** nothing can be accepted for the Competition.
6. The work will be judged on **Thursday 30th JULY, 2020** at the Village Hall, Cartmel.
7. Exhibitors are asked to classify their work correctly if possible. Where this has not been done the Committee reserve the right to place the article in the most suitable class.
8. Articles may not be claimed before **4pm on Show Day, and must be signed for on removal, before 5pm – Closing of Tent.**
9. **Prize Money** will be paid out in **Tent on Show Day any time between 10am and 4.30pm. Please collect early.**
10. Post parcels must include a list of contents, and sender's name and should be on outside. If to be returned by post, an adhesive label, addressed and stamped with an adequate amount of postage, must be included in the parcel. Goods sent by rail cannot be accepted.
11. No framed screens or pictures can be accepted unless delivered to the Village Hall and collected from the Marquee on Show Day. Please discuss exceptionally large or heavy items with the Secretary before entering.
12. In awarding prizes, originality, cleanliness, suitability of materials, pattern and stitch are considered. If the exhibitor claims an embroidery design as original a signed statement to this effect should be attached to the entry form
13. Where there are less than four entries in a class, or where the judges consider that none of the exhibits are of a sufficiently high standard, they may withhold any or all of the prizes.
14. No single article may be entered in more than one class.
15. The Committee reserves to itself the sole right to interpret these regulations and Prize Sheet, and to determine all matters in regard thereto or otherwise arising out of the Show.
16. Privacy Policy - your entry data will be held electronically and in paper form by the Village Industries section of Cartmel Show. This information will not be passed to third parties. Results information may be published (in printed form and online) and provided to the Press and other media for publication.

A small memento will be presented to any person winning an individual cup for three years in succession.

Points awarded as follows: 1st – 5 points; 2nd – 4 points; 3rd – 3 points; 4th – 2 points; HC & C – 1 point
