The vegetables should be displayed within an area of 45cm x 60cm without bending any part of them. No part of any exhibit should exceed the size of the tray. A black base cloth is permitted, and the tray maybe painted. Parsley is permitted for garnishing, but noother accessories such as plates, sand rings etc will be allowed.
